Silvercrest Elementary PTA General Meeting Minutes November 17, 2022

The General Meeting of the Silvercrest PTA was called to order on November 17, 2022 at 6:35 PM in the cafeteria at Silvercrest Elementary by President Melissa Henry.

Stephanie Boehm, Secretary, was present to record minutes. A quorum was established.

Dhara Mistry, 1st Vice President, led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Henry started off by welcoming everyone to the General Meeting and directed attention to the handouts and flyers on the entry table. President Henry introduced herself and then introduced the other Executive Officers present: Dhara Mistry as 1st Vice President Fundraising, Annette Wolff as 2nd Vice President Programs, Stephanie Boehm as Secretary, and Kelsey Tarpinian as Treasurer.

Officer Reports

Secretary's Report, Stephanie Boehm:

The minutes of the PTA General Meeting held on September 22, 2022 were distributed through the PTA website. One correction was made: to add the held balance in escrow to the financial report section, in the amount of \$765 for state and national dues. With no other corrections, the minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report, Kelsey Tarpinian:

The Treasurer's report from 09/20/2022 to 11/14/2022 showed:

The balance held in escrow is for state and national dues. The report was filed for financial reconciliation.

President's Report, Melissa Henry:

President Henry listed some year-to-date accomplishments:

- The Fall Family Fun Night was a fun event with a great turnout.
- The Book Fair was very successful.
- The Books Between Kids Book Drive was a huge success with the final count at double the goal.
- Red Ribbon week was a great week ending with a parade by the students.
- The Food Drive goal was surpassed with donations going to the Pearland Neighborhood Center.
- Hospitality provided several luncheons and treats for teachers and staff already this year.

Installation of the 3rd Playground Shade Structure

President Henry announced that over the Thanksgiving break, the 3rd playground shade structure donated to the school by the PTA for the 2021-2022 year end gift will be installed.

Join PTA

President Henry encouraged all present to join the PTA and to help recruit other parents, family members, and community members into the PTA membership. Ms. Henry directed attention to the QR code on the agenda which contained a link to joinPTA.org.

Addition of New Board Members

Ms. Henry announced that two members have joined the Executive Board: Jennifer Lively as the Volunteer Coordinator Chair, and Amanda Lee as the Stallion Stampede Chair (in preparation for next school year).

Committee Reports

Fall Fundraiser (Boosterthon), Dhara Mistry, 1st Vice President:

Ms. Mistry shared information about the results of the Boosterthon Fall Fundraiser; the total raised was \$39,816, which amounts to \$118 raised per student. Ms. Mistry shared a handout with statistics (attached) of the current and past Boosterthon fundraisers; since 2016 the SC PTA has raised over \$200,000 using Boosterthon. Ms. Mistry said the kids all had a great time at the Glow Run and pictures were posted on the Facebook pages.

Reflections, Julie Riley, Arts in Education Chair:

Ms. Riley announced that the Reflections contest judging took place with 16 total entries from Silvercrest. Ms. Riley said that the Reflections Celebration for all advancing and placing entries will happen after the General PTA Meeting in January.

Ms. Riley also shared that Silvercrest PTA resumed performances for students at the school this year, and 2nd grade enjoyed *Cool Chemistry*, presented by Houston Museum of Natural Science.

Upcoming performances include:

- Pre-K through 1st grade *Rhyme, Reason, and Shadow Puppetry* presented by the Puppet Pizzazz via Young Audiences of Houston scheduled for January 27, 2023
- 3rd-4th grade *The Healthy Hip Hop Show* presented by the FLY Dance Company via Young Audiences of Houston scheduled for May 15, 2023
- All Grades Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus! Presented by Main Street Theater scheduled for February 8, 2023

Fall Family Fun Night, Patricia McLean, Family Fun Night Chair:

Ms. Henry shared on behalf of Ms. McLean that the Fall Family Fun Night was a great time and thanked all volunteers and attendees. Ms. Henry said that the upcoming Winter Wonderland Family Fun Night is scheduled for December 8 from 5:30-7:30pm in the cafeteria. Ms. Henry announced that Santa and Mrs. Claus will be there for pictures, there will be food available for purchase and crafts and activities for kids.

Membership Report, Jennifer Fritz, Membership Chair:

Ms. Henry reported on behalf of Ms. Fritz that the PTA was short of 26 members to reach the membership goal of having 100% of last year's membership. Ms. Henry said the cost of membership is \$10, which goes towards state and national dues and helps fund activities and events at Silvercrest. Ms. Henry reiterated that everyone can join, family members, grandparents, neighbors, and students. Ms. Henry referenced the QR code on the agenda with the link to join.

Spirit Night, Anna Rueda, Retail Partners and Spirit Nights Chair:

Ms. Rueda reported that the last several spirit nights were successful: Jimmy Changas made over \$600, Mod Pizza made \$209, and Grace Pizza and Shakes had a large attendance and made \$273. The next spirit night is Kendra Scott for online shopping the first weekend of December (midnight to midnight December 3rd to 4th) or in-person shopping at the Baybrook location (December 4 from 12-2pm).

STEP Tutoring & Reading Enrichment, Shannon Farrimond, STEP & Reading Enrichment Chair:

Ms. Henry reported on behalf of Ms. Farrimond that the STEP program is in full swing with tutors reading 30 minutes each week with a 1st grader to bolster reading skills and confidence. Ms. Henry said the STEP program has 18 students receiving services.

Ms. Henry also reported that the Books Between Kids Book Drive for reading enrichment was a huge success, with 1,544 books collected (well over double the goal of 700 books). The books were donated to Books Between Kids, where underprivileged children get to shop a book fair for free. Ms. Henry said that 4th grade won a donut party for having the most books collected for their grade.

Community Outreach, Sarah Hawks, Community Outreach Chair:

Ms. Henry reported on behalf of Ms. Hawks that the Food Drive was a huge success with 2,285 items donated to the Pearland Neighborhood Center. Ms. Henry said 3rd grade won a donut party for having the most items donated.

Ms. Henry said the Swap Shop is in need of socks, underwear, and shoes, so the PTA will be doing a Seats and Feets drive to collect those donated items from December 1-8. Ms. Henry said the grade with most items collected will win a party.

Yearbook, Kim Booth, Yearbook Chair:

Ms. Booth said that the yearbook designing is going well and showed a preview of the cover. Ms. Booth said she is looking into hosting a workshop session to help those who need assistance with designing their yearbook pages. Ms. Booth also said April 7, 2023 is the deadline to order, and provided a QR code to Treering for purchasing or adding photos.

New Business

Fall Fundraiser 2023 Vote

Ms. Henry reported that the Executive Board met and made the recommendation to sign a contract now to secure the full-service offering with Boosterthon for the Gallop and Glow Run Fall 2023 fundraiser.

Ms. Mistry said the event dates would kick off on September 14, 2023 and conclude with the Glow Run on September 22, 2023.

Ms. Mistry moved that the Silvercrest PTA sign a contract with Boosterthon to provide the full-service offering Glow Run for the Fall 2023 Fundraiser. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

PTA Bylaws and Standing Rules Committee

Ms. Henry gave notice that a committee to review the bylaws and standing rules will be appointed, and the proposed changes and recommendations will be voted on at the next General Meeting.

Volunteer Opportunities

Ms. Lively reported that there is a standing volunteer list that can be pulled from for any volunteer needs that arise.

Swap Shop Volunteer Needs

Ms. Henry said that the district Swap Shop is a resource that services many students in need every month at their community closet. Students can go to the Swap Shop and exchange clothes they have outgrown for a different size or pick out clothes with vouchers received from the school. Ms. Henry said the upcoming Seats and Feets Drive is going towards the Swap Shop. Ms. Henry said that volunteers are needed to work at the Swap Shop once a month and during other times to help with organizing and sorting clothes; a QR code to the signup was located on the back of the agenda.

Lost and Found Cleanup

Ms. Henry said that students are encouraged to visit the Lost and Found cabinet located in the main hallway when they misplace items. Ms. Henry said the cabinet is currently overflowing with hoodies, sweaters, water bottles and lunch kits. Ms. Henry asked all present to please stop by the cabinet tonight or the in December during the upcoming school events to please collect lost items; the deadline to collect lost items is Friday, December 16; all unclaimed items will be donated to the Swap Shop on December 17.

Kindness Card Project

Ms. Wolff shared that in conjunction with Kindness Week, Silvercrest PTA has coordinated a kindness card project. Students at Silvercrest made cards in their classes for kids that are in hospitals and their families. Ms. Wolff said that there is a box in the front hallway for card donations and supplies are available after the meeting to create more cards to donate. Ms. Wolff gave information about the Ronald McDonald House and Texas Children's Hospital, the recipients of the card donations.

Principal Announcements, LaShonda Pernetter

Ms. Pernetter said they have a lot of fun events coming up, including an author who is coming to read to the kids on November 30; the book ties into the next school theme which is empathy.

Ms. Pernetter reported that last month the rugby team came which was a lot of fun, and that the Space City Cowboys (baseball) are booked to come visit the school on February 17 to talk about reading with the kids.

Ms. Pernetter said that the new fast pass system worked very well for the Kindergarten feast, and they would be continuing the fast pass system for the parties in December so please utilize it to cut down on lines.

Ms. Pernetter also said the teachers and staff really enjoyed the soup luncheon, and they appreciate everything the PTA continues to do for the school.
