Old Business

Budget Amendments, Kelsey Tarpinian - Treasurer

The Budget and Finance Committee, comprised of Kelsey Tarpinian, Melissa Henry, Melissa Leach, Kimberly Booth, Martha Deem, and Ami Damani, met on December 8, 2023 to discuss adjustments to the 2023 to 2024 PTA budget. Kelsey Tarpinian provided a recap this meeting. To address current budget challenges, set realistic goals/budgets for the remainder of the school year, and bring the budget closer to breaking even; the following amendments are proposed. It was noted that the PTA is in good financial standing and has enough funds in reserve to offset any negative balance for the year and continue with our commitment to the school with our end of year gift.

- Executive Treasurer Decrease budgeted expenses from \$300 to \$250 *Keep at \$300 next year due to MoneyMinder increase
- Fall Fundraiser Decrease budgeted expenses from \$4,072 to \$4,000.75 *Will be writing check to school in the amount of \$3,757 for 10% kick back for Fall Fundraiser participation

- Retail Partner Spirit Nights Decrease Budgeted Income from \$4,000 to \$2,500 and decrease Budgeted Expenses from \$100 to \$0
- School Supplies Decrease Budgeted Income from \$1,000 to \$557.34 *Looking into utilizing a kick-back from this program moving forward EPI agreed to sending us \$500 this year since the non-kick-back was an oversight this year compared to how it was run last year.
- Spirit Day Increase Budgeted Expenses from \$2,500 to \$3,000
- Spirit Wear Increase Budgeted Income from \$1,000 to \$2,500 and Increase Budgeted Expenses from \$4,310 to \$6,923 - cup and blanket sales did not go as well as anticipated and we will need to sell the remaining blankets on-hand at at least \$30 per blanket in order to break even
- Spring Fundraiser Decrease Budgeted Income from \$20,000 to \$17,000 and Decrease Budgeted Expenses from \$3,000 to \$1,900

- STEP Tutoring Decrease Budgeted Expenses from \$1,000 to \$500 *What was spent last year

The proposed changes bring our year-end balance to -\$907.87 and our bank account balance to \$37,773.94.

A motion was made by Kelsey Tarpinian. "I move that the 2023-2024 budget amendment recommendations from the PTA executive board, as drafted by the Financial Committee, be accepted as presented. "Seconded by Dhara Mistry.

The floor was opened for discussion. Hearing none, the discussion was closed.

A vote was held. All were in favor, none opposed. The motion passed.

<u>Tax Free Days, Kelsey Tarpinian - Treasurer</u>

The PTA is allowed to declare two tax-free days per school year. The Executive Board is proposing the tax-free day for the second semester to be held on February 26th when blankets will be distributed.

A motion was made by Kelsey Tarpinian. "I move that the tax-free day occur on February 26th." Seconded by Dhara Mistry. A vote was held. All were in favor, none opposed. The motion passed.

New Business

Bylaw Review Committee Nominees, Melissa Henry - President

The Silvercrest Bylaws must be reviewed and updated every three years. To complete this requirement, a committee has been established to review the bylaws. This committee includes:

The review meeting will take place on or around February 8th and changes to the Bylaws will be presented for approval at the next General Membership meeting on March 21st.

This committee will be made up of three members and two alternates and will be responsible for identifying individuals to fill our elected officer positions for the 2024-2025 school year. The officer positions include: President, 1st Vice President – Fundraising, 2nd Vice President – Programs, Treasurer, and Secretary. The election of these officers will take place the General Membership Meeting on March 21.

To familiarize everyone with the process of electing the nominating committee and its members' duties, Dhara Mistry read aloud the following portion the Silvercrest PTA Bylaws:

Article VII, Section 1 - Per our Standing Rules, the discussions of the nominating committee are confidential. Members will need to sign a confidentiality agreement and may not share anything about the nominating process with anyone not on the committee.

The floor was opened for interested volunteers for this committee. 
